### 1.2. Qualification amendments and adding and dropping of module(s):

Students who have registered according to the schedule above can proceed with add and drop of modules at the faculty, from 08h00 for signatures and Great hall from 08h00 for capturing, starting on the **4<sup>th</sup> February 2019 to 15<sup>th</sup> February 2019**.

### 1.3. Study guides material:

After academic registration, students should present themselves at the A3 Building Academic Development Centre (ADC) Study Guide Distribution Office (A3 General Academic Building, Block C) after final completion of academic registration to collect their study guides materials.

### 1.4. Orientation programme for new students

Orientation for new undergraduate students will take place from **28<sup>th</sup> January 2019 to 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2019** and is only open to registered students. Details of the programme will be made available at the time of registration.

### 1.5. International students

All international students should be in possession of a valid study permit and a valid medical aid, before they register. No extension of registration will be permitted if an international student is not in possession of a study permit at the time of registration. Please note that in order to obtain a study permit, an admission letter and proof of membership of a comprehensive medical aid scheme must be submitted to the Department of Home Affairs or a South African foreign mission.

## 2. Tuition and residence fee Information for 2019 academic year

### 2.1. Minimum amount payable on registration

Full information about fees and other charges for 2019 will be available on the website of the university and at registration. Students are liable for tuition fees and, if they stay in a University residence, residence fees. All students (both new and returning) must pay the following on registration (*Approved amounts will be available soon*):

- a) Non-refundable academic registration fee
- b) Minimum tuition deposit
- c) Minimum residence deposit (If admitted to a university residence).

**The balance of tuition and other academic fees for 2019 must be paid on registration or students may arrange to pay in six equal monthly instalments from 28<sup>th</sup> February 2019 to 31 July 2019. Students, who are in arrears with their fee accounts, will be charged interest on outstanding amounts.**

### Important Information:

**The University reserves the following rights in respect of students who fail to comply with the above provisions:**

- a) Handing over of overdue accounts to the University's attorneys to collect the amount owing;
- b) exclusion of students in default from examinations, graduation and residences and deregistration.
- c) No student may be admitted to a residence unless the registration fee and 50% of the annual residence fee has been paid. **Students may not attend classes and write tests and examinations for modules for which they are not registered.**
