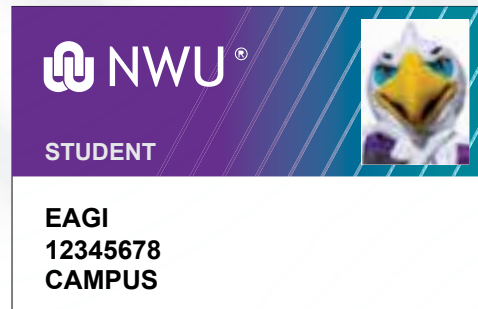

What is it?

Identity confirmation card declaring you as a current full-time registered student at NWU



What is it used for?

Your student card provides access to the NWU's Potchefstroom Campus:

- Main gates
- Turnstiles
- Faculty buildings
- Residences

(only registered residents of the residence)
Taking attendance in the class and examination rooms.

You can also pay* with your student card at:

All Dining halls, kiosks, the Klipoog Cafeteria and the Draakenstein on campus.

- Selected retailers and restaurants
- Gym and Squash at the indoor sports center
- Nashua for any type of printing

(* Make sure there are funds available on your vending account to pay)

Did you know?

The student number is automatically generated by the system. Consecutive numbers differs with a number of 8 (e.g.12345686 will be the follow-up of 12345678). The last two numbers are of such a nature that no two students will have the same first seven numbers (e.g. if a number is 12345671 there cannot be a student number 12345679). There is a bar in Mozambique (Ponta de Ora), Fernandos, where it is tradition to put your student card up against the wall when you visit.

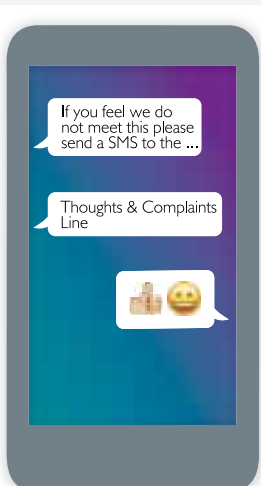

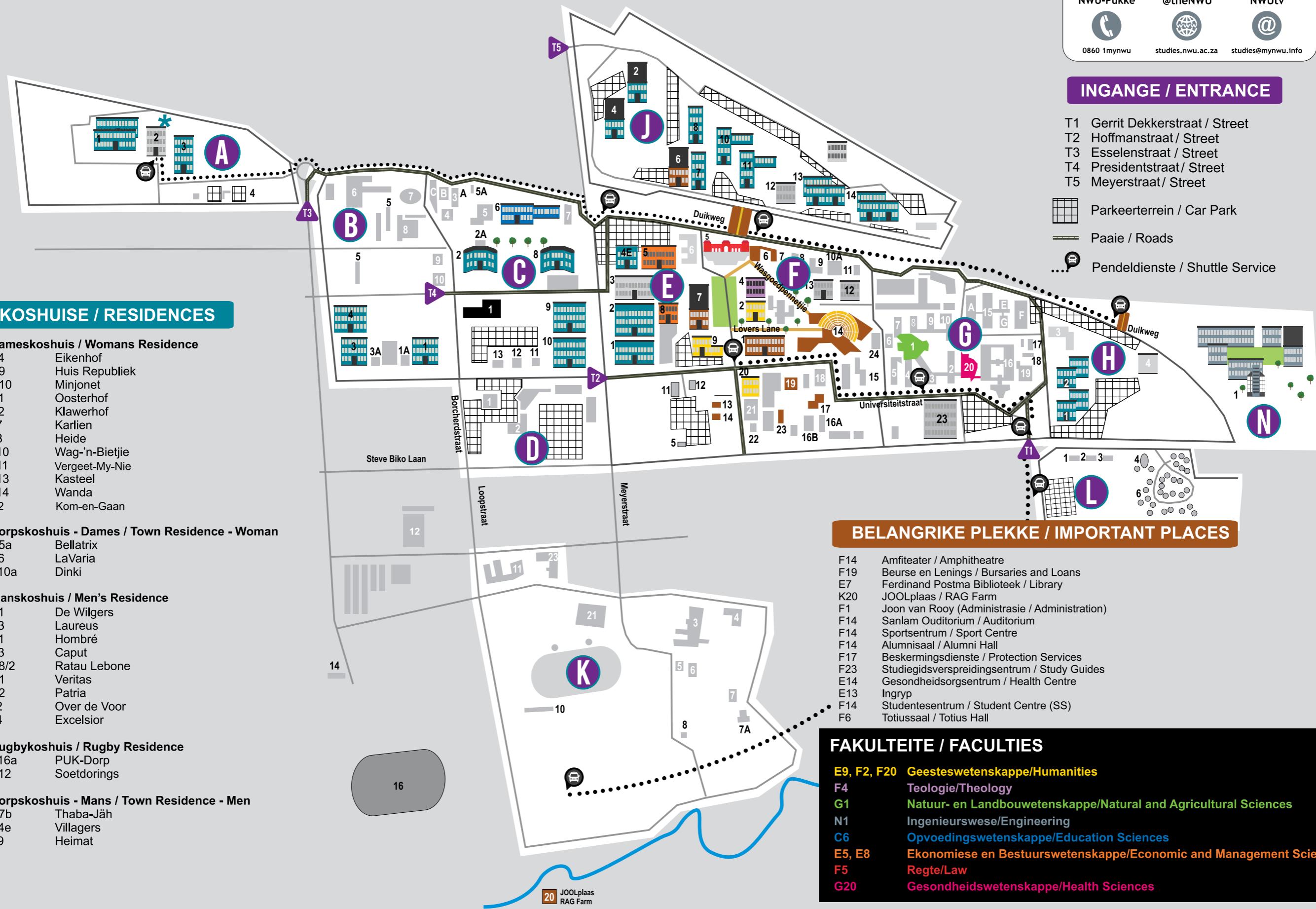
