

Your student number is automatically generated when you apply at the North-West University. Consecutive numbers differ with a number of 8 (e.g. 12345686 will be the follow-up of 12345678). The last two numbers are of such a nature that no two students will have the same first six numbers (e.g. if a number is 12345671 there cannot be a student number 12345679).
