- Residences

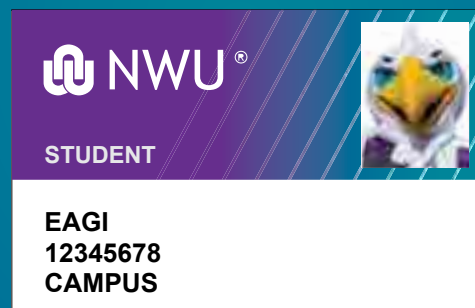

Did you know?

The student number is automatically generated by the system. Consecutive numbers differ with a number of 8 (e.g. 12345686 will be the follow-up of 12345678). The last two numbers are of such a nature that no two students will have the same first seven numbers (e.g. if a number is 12345671 there cannot be a student number 12345679). There is a bar in Mozambique (Ponta do Ouro), Fernandos, where it is tradition to put your student card up against the wall when you visit.

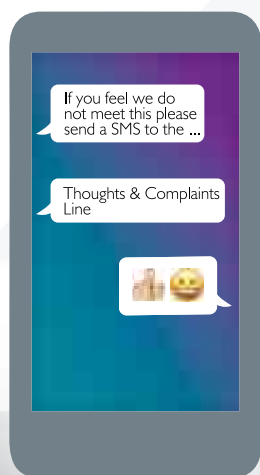
